How your bequest will help

You can make a bequest for a specific program or an unrestricted bequest.

A specific bequest can support any area where you would like to have an impact. Your gift can help pay for student scholarships; an area of study or research; Macquarie's scholarly museums and art collections; the Macquarie University Hospital; or campus services such as sports facilities. Or you could join Margaret Donaldson, Joan McIlrath, Mabel Harriet Sutton, Marjorie Keesing and the Fernando family, who all left bequests to the University's Library.

Unrestricted bequests may fund a range of purposes, creating opportunities for future students and supporting Macquarie's teaching, learning and research programs.

The Macquarie University Foundation and University Council will take responsibility for determining areas of greatest need to which unrestricted bequests are directed.

Types of bequests

There are many ways in which you can leave a bequest to Macquarie University.

You can leave a percentage of your estate, a fixed amount or the residue of your estate. Alternatively, bequests can be in the form of real estate, art works, rare collections, shares, bonds or other support.

We can work with you to manage your bequest, whether you have a specific purpose in mind or choose to leave an unrestricted bequest.

If you wish to make a bequest for a specific purpose, the University can help you draft a formal Statement of Intention for your signature. The Statement will acknowledge your gift and ensure that we share your understanding of the terms of your bequest.

*The late Mrs I J (Bill) Cantwell supported Macquarie University throughout its early development. Under the terms of her Will, she left a number of significant artworks to the University. Among them is **Escape**, a magnificent work by the internationally recognised Australian artist, Sidney Nolan.*

Your Will

We suggest you talk to your solicitor or trustee about your bequest, along with your family. For unrestricted bequests, you may care to use the following wording:

“I give to Macquarie University
(amount or item to be inserted)
and I direct that the receipt of the
Chief Financial Officer for the time
being of the University shall be
sufficient discharge for the same”.

We also encourage you to talk to our Planned Giving Manager who can help you structure your bequest. We can offer you opportunities for recognition of your bequest. Or, if you prefer, we will honour your request for anonymity.
