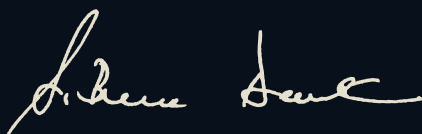

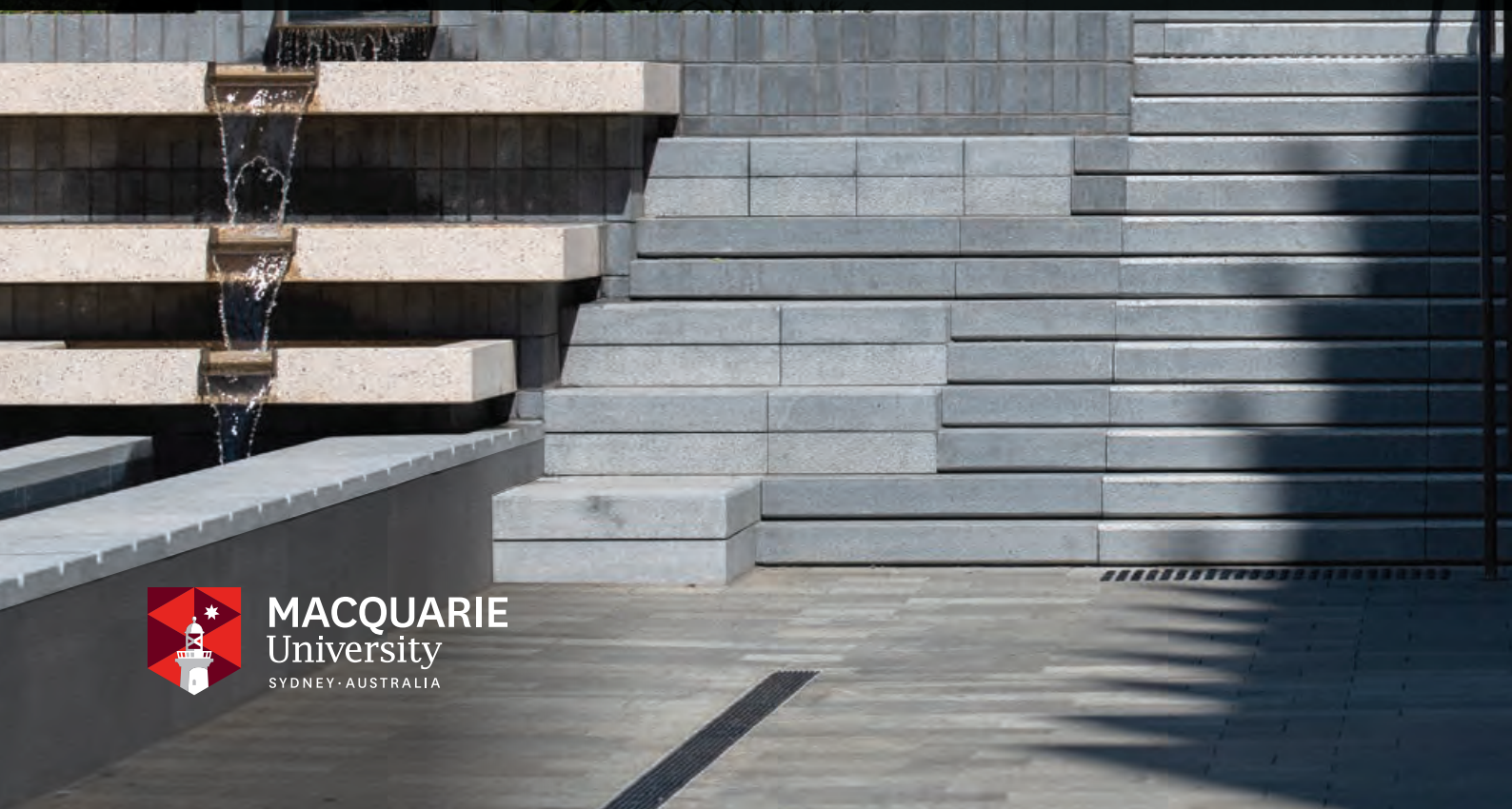

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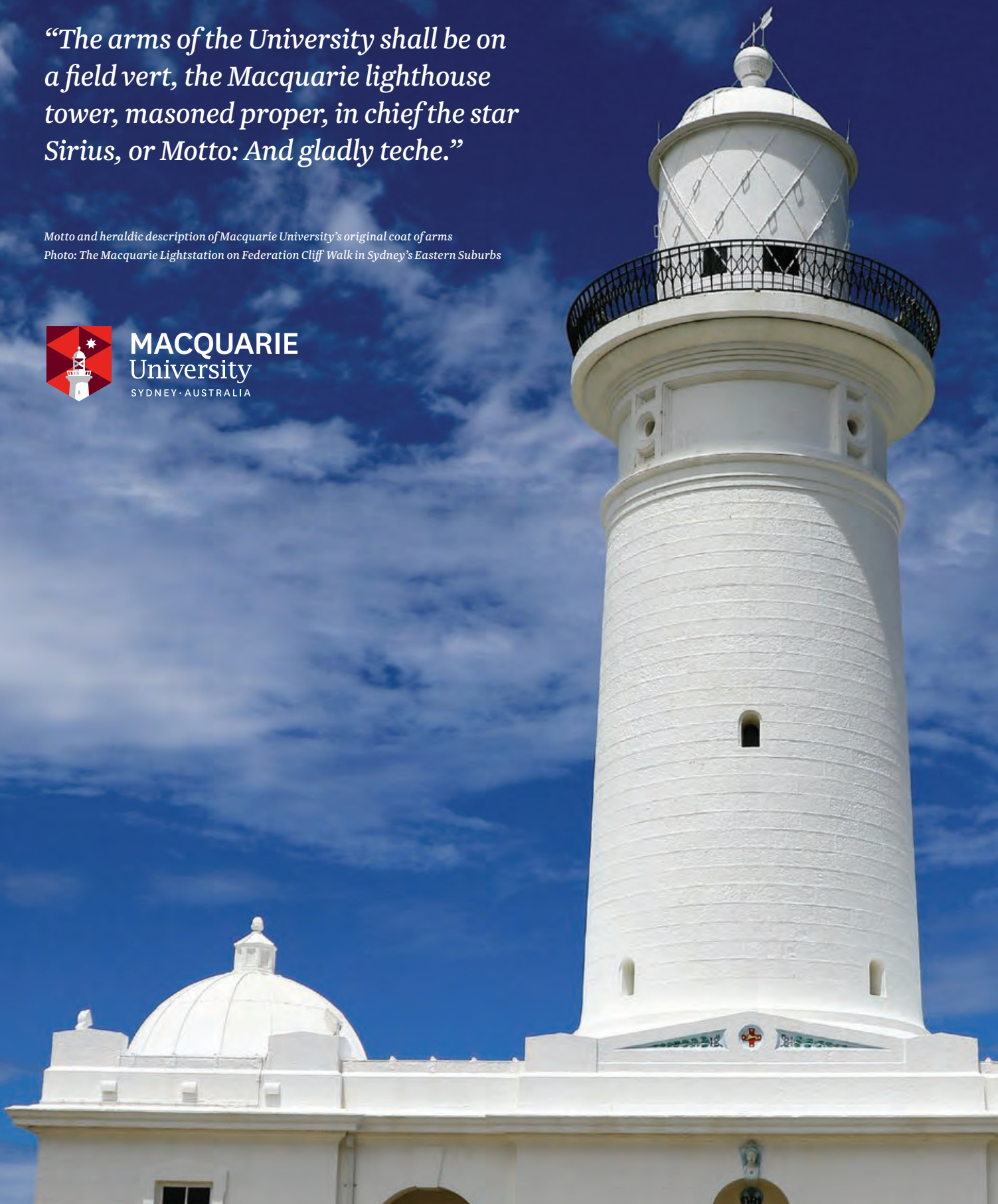

Founded in 1964, Macquarie University has been a pioneer in many fields, including our open admissions procedures, student choice, semester and grading systems, small group teaching and academic self-appraisal. Most of these practices are now widespread, but at the time, they were undeniably pioneering.

NAMING THE UNIVERSITY

Choosing the name for Sydney's third metropolitan university came down to two different schools of thought: those who wanted to commemorate a great Australian figure in education and those who preferred a geographical name.

In 1964, the New South Wales State Cabinet chose in favour of naming the University after a prominent Australian. In the end, Governor Lachlan Macquarie – the fifth Governor of New South Wales – was chosen ahead of suggestions which included WC Wentworth and Sir Henry Parkes.

Macquarie was a man noted for his humanitarianism and interest in education, and another famous landmark – the Macquarie Lighthouse – also carries his name. The lighthouse has a long association with the University, as part of the University's coat of arms. It serves as a strong metaphor for the University's future ambitions. It is a symbol of the support, encouragement and reassurance that the University provides to students and staff, so they can venture into unknown territories of intellectual enquiry with great confidence and conviction. The University's landmark acknowledges both the Macquarie Lighthouse and the Sirius star, the guiding star and flagship of the First Fleet.

GOVERNOR MACQUARIE

In April 1809, Macquarie was appointed Governor of New South Wales – designated to replace William Bligh. Macquarie and his wife sailed from Portsmouth, England, and arrived at Port Jackson, Sydney, on 28 December. He took up his commission as governor on 1 January 1810. From the outset, Macquarie saw the colony as a community as well as a penal settlement. However, his term of office also coincided with an increase in the number of convicts sent to the colony. His solution was to commence an ambitious program of public works (new buildings, towns and roads) to help absorb these numbers. He also extended the practice of ticket-of-leave for convicts.

This policy of encouraging convicts and former convicts (emancipists) brought him into conflict with an influential conservative section of the local society. This group, known as the 'exclusives', sought to restrict civil rights and

judicial privileges to itself. Many of these free settlers also had influential friends in English political circles.

Frustration and recurring bouts of illness led Macquarie to submit his resignation on several occasions. A serious illness in 1819 almost proved fatal, and the pressures of a commission of inquiry into the state of the colony reinforced his desire to end his term of office and return home to defend the charges made against his administration. Finally, at the end of 1820, he learned that his third application for resignation had been accepted. However, it was not until 12 February 1822 that he and his wife and son departed for England.

Macquarie University's Lachlan and Elizabeth Macquarie Archive (mq.edu.au/macquarie-archive/lema/index.html) is a digital project providing full-text manuscript transcriptions and associated research materials relating to the lives and times of Governor Lachlan Macquarie (1761–1824) and his second wife, Elizabeth [nee Campbell] (1778–1835).

MACQUARIE LIGHTHOUSE AND HMS SIRIUS

The Macquarie Lighthouse was the first lighthouse built in Australia. Shortly after the arrival of the First Fleet in 1788, Governor Phillip ordered a flagstaff be erected to signal the approach of supply ships bound for Sydney Cove.

A beacon, fired firstly by wood and later by coal, was built in 1791 to guide vessels to the harbour entrance by night, becoming Australia's first marine light. This beacon, tended by convicts, guided shipping for the next 25 years.

On 13 July 1816, Governor Lachlan Macquarie laid the foundation stone of the new lighthouse. The lighthouse was to be the first of many significant works by the convict architect Francis Greenway.

The present building is a replica built in 1880 by colonial architect James Barnet. However, the original building was not demolished until 1883, so, for a time, Sydney's South Head boasted two almost identical lighthouses standing side by side.

The first lighthouse keeper was Robert Watson, after whom nearby Watsons Bay was named. He had been quartermaster aboard HMS *Sirius* in the First Fleet. ❖

A most generous scholarship program

With more than AU\$6 million in scholarships and grants, we have a wide range of opportunities to support international students who want to study with us.



Macquarie's range of international scholarships can depend on the country you are from, with other eligibility factors including your field of study and academic achievements. Most have a strong emphasis on social inclusion and equity, while others recognise achievements such as sporting excellence.

VICE-CHANCELLOR'S INTERNATIONAL SCHOLARSHIP

This highly competitive scholarship is based on academic merit and valued up to AU\$10,000 applied towards your tuition fees. Applicants must complete an online application after receiving a full course offer.

COUNTRY AND REGIONAL SCHOLARSHIPS

Scholarships are available for undergraduate and postgraduate students of select countries. The amount is applied towards your tuition fees for the duration of your course. Eligible students will be assessed automatically for this scholarship at the time of course application.

PARTNER- AND GOVERNMENT-FUNDED SCHOLARSHIPS

Macquarie is an approved provider for many international government and academic institution scholarship programs – we also warmly welcome recipients of Australian Government-funded scholarships.

MERIT-BASED SCHOLARSHIPS

Macquarie University awards a range of merit-based scholarships for students in select disciplines.

ALUMNI SCHOLARSHIP

A 10 per cent tuition fee scholarship for the duration of a postgraduate coursework degree for alumni of Macquarie University. Eligible students will be assessed automatically for this scholarship at the time of application.

HOW TO APPLY

Depending on the scholarship, some do not require a separate scholarship application. Applicants will be automatically assessed for the scholarship and eligible students will be made an offer as part of their course offer. Other scholarships will require an application to be submitted. Please visit the international scholarships webpage for specific details on the application process.

Macquarie University's main campus is located just 12.5 kilometres (7.8 miles) from Sydney's city centre, with a range of convenient transport options available.

METRO

Macquarie University is the only university in Australia with its own metro station, located on the corner of Herring Road and University Avenue, adjacent to Macquarie Centre. Services run every four minutes during peak periods, with the Sydney CBD just 18 minutes away by metro.

BUS

Multiple bus services stop within the campus grounds, with additional routes operating from the nearby Macquarie Centre bus interchange, providing easy connections across Sydney.

CAMPUS SHUTTLE

A free shuttle bus operates during sessions, connecting key campus locations, including student accommodation.

WALKING AND CYCLING

The campus features well-lit pedestrian pathways and water stations throughout. Three secure BikeHub facilities provide undercover bicycle parking, lockers and showers, while two bike repair stations offer tools for basic maintenance. Access to BikeHubs is via Campus Card and monitored by security.

DRIVING

For students who prefer to drive to class, Macquarie has more than 4500 parking spaces available across campus. Electric vehicle charging stations are also provided to support sustainable travel options.

Work restrictions apply for student visa holders. The maximum number of hours that may be worked during study terms and sessions is 48 hours per fortnight. English requirements

You must meet Macquarie's English language requirements to be eligible for a degree. You can satisfy these requirements in a number of ways, depending on your circumstances.

For entry to the majority of courses at Macquarie University, a demonstrated level of English language proficiency equivalent to an overall IELTS score of 6.5 with no band below 6.0 (or equivalent) is required. Some courses – including in education, law and medicine – require a higher level of English proficiency. Visit our website for detailed English language requirements for these courses.

WHAT YOU NEED TO MEET THE REQUIREMENTS

There are several ways you can meet the English language requirements. The most frequently used methods are:

- passing an approved English language test at the required level
- holding a qualification from an approved country with English as the language of instruction
- completing an approved high school qualification or foundation program with study in English
- completing an approved English for Academic Purposes (EAP) program.

APPROVED HIGH SCHOOL QUALIFICATION OR FOUNDATION PROGRAM

If you completed one of the qualifications listed at mq.edu.au/english-requirements and achieved the minimum score in the specified English subject, you will be deemed to meet the Competent English language requirement. The study must have been completed within five years of your commencement at Macquarie University (some exceptions apply).

DON'T MEET THE REQUIREMENTS?

If you do not meet the English language requirements for entry to Macquarie, take the most direct route with an English preparation program at the Macquarie University College. You can request a packaged offer with English when you apply for admission.

APPROVED COUNTRIES FOR ENGLISH AS THE LANGUAGE OF INSTRUCTION

If you completed at least two years of a senior secondary qualification or at least one year full-time study at tertiary level with English as the language of instruction in one of the following countries, you will be deemed to meet the Competent English language requirement:

BACHELOR DEGREES

For direct entry into an undergraduate (bachelor) degree, you will need one of the following qualifications:

- a recognised high school qualification or university entrance exam – see the chart for a selection of accepted qualifications
- a recognised university foundation course – we accept foundation courses from most Australian universities, as well as from some approved international providers
- a recognised diploma or associate degree deemed equivalent to an Australian diploma or advanced diploma level
- at least one year of a university degree from a recognised institution deemed equivalent to an Australian bachelor or master degree level.

SELECTION RANK

Macquarie uses a selection rank based on the Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR) to determine the minimum eligibility requirements for entry to each undergraduate degree. See the table for conversion of the selection rank to the minimum score you need for your qualification.

MACQUARIE UNIVERSITY COLLEGE

If you have not met the minimum eligibility requirements for your selected degree, don't worry. Macquarie University College offers a range of pathway programs to prepare you for seamless transition to university studies. 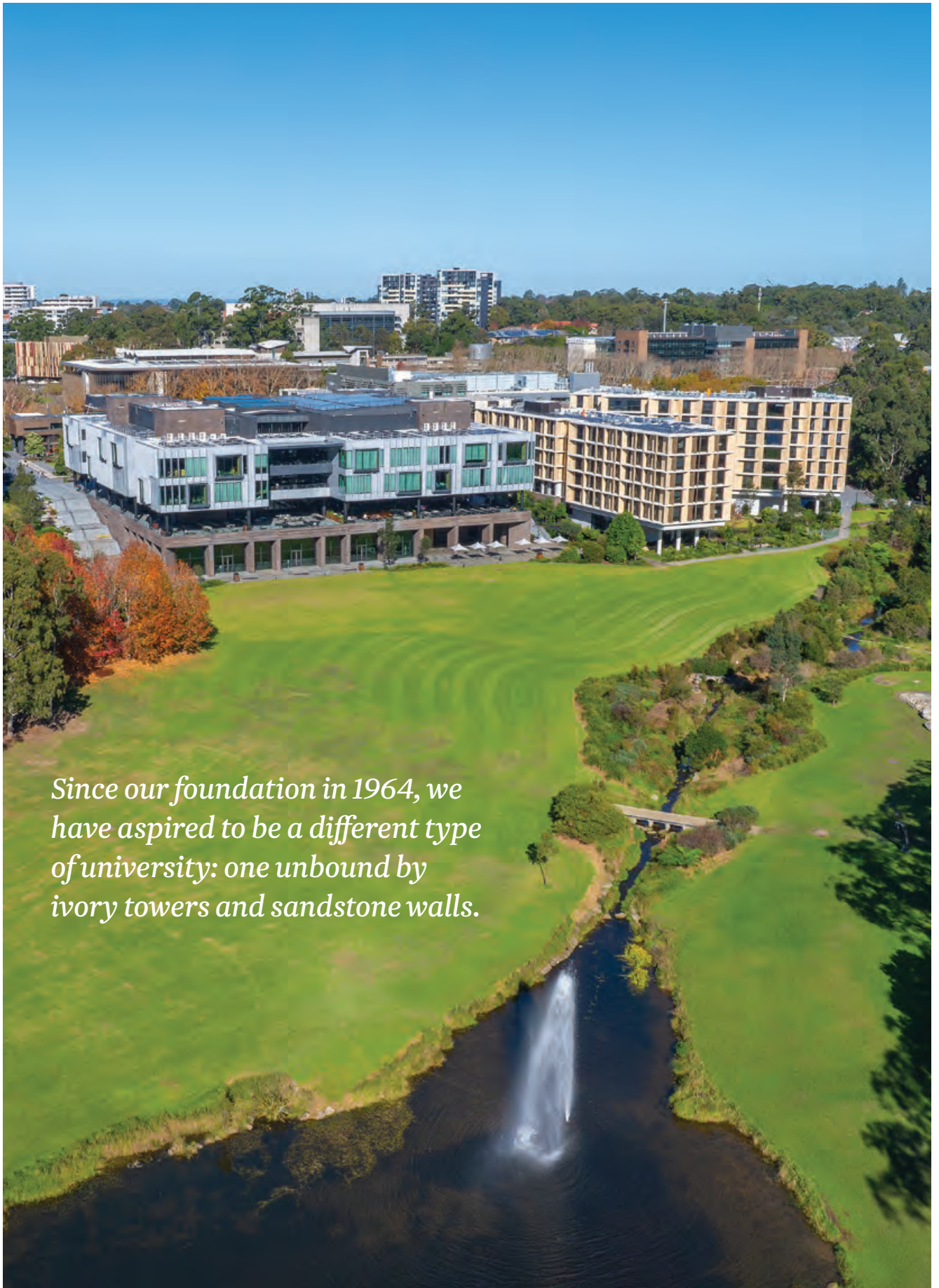

DIPLOMAS, FOUNDATION AND INTENSIVE PROGRAMS

HOW SCORES ARE CALCULATED

GLOBAL
GCE A-Levels

Scores for the United Kingdom and international versions of the General Certificate of Education Advanced Level Examinations (GCE A-Levels) are calculated based on the aggregate of the three best A-level subjects using the following conversions:
A* = 6, A = 5, B = 4, C = 3, D = 2, E = 1. At least two subjects must have been taken in the same academic year, and the third may be from the preceding or following academic year.

Both the United Kingdom and international versions of the GCE A-Levels administered by Cambridge International Examinations (CIE), Council for Curriculum, Examinations and Assessment (CCEA), Oxford International AQA Examinations, Pearson Education International (Edexcel) and WJEC are assessed using these tables. Locally administered O-Level and A-Level examinations for Singapore, Sri Lanka and Zimbabwe are assessed using their own separate tables.

GLOBAL
International Baccalaureate

Scores for the International Baccalaureate (IB) are calculated based on the final aggregate result for six subjects, including any bonus points from Theory of Knowledge subject and Extended Essay. This must include one subject from each of Groups 1-5 (Language and Literature, Language Acquisition, Individuals and Societies, Sciences, and Mathematics) and a sixth subject from either Group 6 (Arts) or a second selection from Groups 1-5. A minimum of three subjects must be completed at Higher Level (HL), with the remainder at Standard Level (SL).

AUSTRALIA
HSC or equivalent

Scores for the Australian Higher School Certificate (HSC) from New South Wales (or equivalent qualifications from other state/territory boards) are based on the Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR).

AUSTRALIA
Australian Foundation

Scores for Australian foundation programs recognised by Macquarie University are calculated based on the overall final result out of 10.0 or by converting percentage marks to a 10-point scale. For entry to some degree programs, students may need to have successfully completed suitable mathematics or other specified subjects as part of their foundation program.

Vevaiosi Prosvasis

Scores for the Greek Vevaiosi Prosvasis (Certificate of Access) examinations are based on the General Admission Grade (out of 20) for all subjects.

HONG KONG
HKDSE

Scores for the Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education (HKDSE) are calculated based on the aggregate of the five best Category A and C subjects. Category B subjects are not considered.

Category A (Senior Secondary) subjects include the four compulsory core subjects (Chinese, English, Liberal Studies and Mathematics) and a choice of elective subjects. Category B subjects are Applied Learning electives and Category C subjects are for Other Languages (French, German, Japanese, Spanish, Hindi and Urdu).

Points for all subjects are calculated using the following score conversions: 5*/5* = 6, 5 = 5, 4 = 4, 3 = 3, 2 = 2, 1 = 1.

Hungarian Matriculation Certificate

Scores for the Hungarian Matriculation Certificate (Gimnáziumi Érettségi Bizonyítvány) are calculated based on the overall average grade on the examination results using the following conversions: Excellent/Very Good (Jeles) = 5, Good (Jó) = 4, Fair/Average (Közepes) = 3, Satisfactory/Pass (Elégéséges) = 2, Fail (Elégtelen) = 1.

AISSC

Scores for the All India Senior School Certificate (AISSC) awarded by the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) are calculated based on the average marks of the best four externally examined academic subjects.

Scores for the Indian Higher Secondary School Certificate (HSSC) from state boards are calculated based on the average marks for all subjects.

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JAPAN

Common Test for University Admissions

Scores for the Common Test for University Admissions (prior to 2021 known as the Japanese National Center Test (大学入試センター試験)) are calculated using the average of the 7 best subjects' Hensachi scores. The Center Test results are considered together with evidence of successful completion of the Upper Secondary School Graduation Diploma (Kotogakko Sotsugyo Shomeisho or 高等学校卒業証書).

KCSE

Scores for the Kenyan Certificate of Secondary Education (KCSE) are calculated based on the aggregate score of the best seven subjects using the following conversions: A = 12, A- = 11, B+ = 10, B = 9, B- = 8, C+ = 7, C = 6, C- = 5, D+ = 4, D = 3, D- = 2, E = 1.

LEBANON

Baccalauréat Libanais

Scores for the Baccalauréat Libanais (Lebanese General Secondary Certificate or دبلوم العامة) are calculated out of 20 based on the overall grade for all subjects (ie marks achieved/ maximum marks 20).

Scores are calculated using the following conversions: A = 7, A- = 6, B+ = 5, B = 4, B- = 3, C+ = 2, C = 1, C- = 0, D+ = 0, D = 0, F = 0.

MALAYSIA

UEC

Scores for the Malaysian Unified Examination Certificate (UEC) are calculated based on the average of the four compulsory subjects (Chinese, Malay, English and Mathematics) and the best four other subjects using the following conversions: A1 = 1, A2 = 2, B3 = 3, B4 = 4, B5 = 5, B6 = 6, C7 = 7, C8 = 8, F9 = 9.

MEXICO

Diploma de Bachiller

Scores for the Mexican Diploma de Bachiller are based on the overall average out of 10.

MONGOLIA

Mongolian Certificate of Complete Secondary Education

Scores for the Mongolian Certificate of Complete Secondary Education are calculated on the average of the final marks of all subjects.

NCUK

International Foundation Year (IFY)

Scores for the NCUK are based on the aggregate of the three best A-level subjects using the following conversions: A* = 6, A = 5, B = 4, C = 3, D = 2, E = 1.

NEPAL

HSEC

Scores for the Nepalese Higher Secondary Education Certificate (HSEC) awarded by the Higher Secondary Education Board from 2018 are calculated based on the cumulative GPA (CGPA) of all Grade 12 subjects.

NORWAY

USSE

Scores for the Upper Secondary School Examination Certificate (USSE) are calculated based on the average grade for all subjects. This assessment only applies for the Vitnemål fra den videregående skole, Vitnemål for videregående opplæring or Examen Artium.

Swiss Federal Maturity Certificate

Scores for the Swiss Federal Maturity Certificate are calculated based on the aggregate score for all 12 subjects and the Maturity Project.

Entry to some courses may require a degree in a specific or related field of study and/or achievement of a particular

weighted average mark (WAM) out of 100. Relevant work experience or professional accreditation may also be considered.

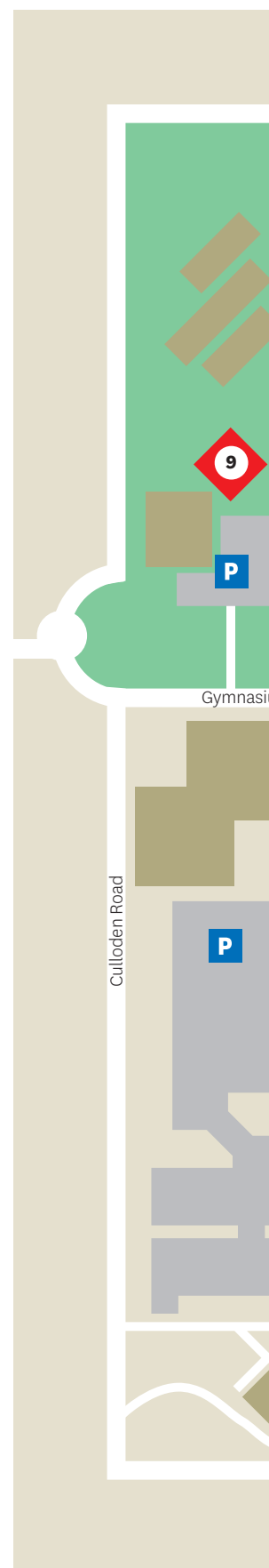
