Mia Mia: Being a Baby, Belonging and Becoming Part 6

Mia Mia: Being a Baby, Belonging and Becoming is a broadcast standard DVD aimed at promoting awareness and discussion of issues relating to quality and pedagogy in early childhood programs.

Mia Mia is a 51 place long day early childhood program. Mia Mia is the demonstration program for the Department of Educational Studies Early Childhood Teacher Education Program at Macquarie University.

The 30 sequences in Part 6 of the series of Mia Mia publications provides an overview of the learning and nurturing experiences of four infants in the Mia Mia Nursery with their families, teachers and nursery staff over one year. The Introduction sequence describes the settling in process for children and includes interviews with the four families about the transition from home to Mia Mia.

The following sequences provide a glimpse into children's development throughout the year, as they relate to others, communicate, move, explore to satisfy their curiosity, engage in problem solving and play. In the vignettes children's dispositions are evident and their development in understanding the culture of the learning community, and ways of being, belonging and becoming.

The specialised skills of the early childhood teachers are evident throughout the sequences. All of the team demonstrate the respect and nurturing that is the right of every child in a formal care setting. This resource will be useful for undergraduate and postgraduate students interested in children's early development and quality early childhood education. The sequences reveal the complex world of infants.

Each sequence can be viewed independently and each vignette is a different length of time, however the total running time of the introduction and 29 sequences is 2 hours and 33 minutes. The DVD and streaming program is accompanied by a Study Guide with brief synopsis of what is occurring and thinking points for each sequence. The index affords the opportunity to select particular sequences for particular topics for screening and discussion.
