Studying the Past is the Faculty of Arts' education and engagement initiative which facilitates engaging curriculum-linked workshops and programs for Modern and Ancient History students. The program links the discipline expertise of academics and researchers from Macquarie with schools and community groups.

The Ancient History Stage 6 excursion program hosted at our Wallumattagal (North Ryde) Campus and run for 3.5 hrs (incl. 30 minute break). The 3 components are as follows:

- 1. MuseumTour
- 2. Seminar
- 3. Workshop

The *Museum Tour* examines the collection housed at the Macquarie University History Museum and addresses Conservation and Presentation of Cultural Heritage. Seminars present the latest scholarly research on topics and concentrate on the analysis of sources. Workshops are engaging and tactile opportunities for students to put their historical skills into practise through Object-Based Learning.

Seminars, both in-person and online, may be prepared and presented by one of MQ's academics (additional cost incurred and subject to availability of staff). Otherwise, seminars are delivered by current PhD students, recent PhD graduates and/or Early Career Researchers within the department.

Students excavate, translate an ancient script, study human remains, interpret objects, and reconstruct ceramic vessels to deduce key facts of an archaeological site and the people associated with the site.
Roman Numismatics and Epigraphy	Students study numismatic collections and learn how to translate, interpret, and analyse written evidence. Using the <i>Australian Centre for Ancient Numismatics</i> (ACANS) extensive collection, students handle ancient coins and learn about their historical importance.
Artefact Analysis	In this workshop, students handle artefacts from the Macquarie University History Museum's teaching collection. Objects from both the ancient and modern world are included in this collection. Students will get firsthand experience in object analysis and learn the importance in analysing and interpreting material remains to better understand the past.
