


**Shared Academic Governance - Academic Senate retains authority for the following matters:**

1	Approve policies on academic matters including but not limited to, learning and teaching, research and research training, academic integrity and quality assurance, merit prizes and awards, programs of study and measures to safeguard academic freedom <i>Note: Recommended amendment includes the definition of academic matters approved by Council October 2018</i>
2	Approve the academic requirements for award courses, including degrees, diplomas and certificates offered by the University
3	Approve amendments to the academic requirements for award courses, including degrees, diplomas and certificates offered by the University
4	Approve establishment or disestablishment of an award course, including degrees, diplomas and certificates, including those offered by the University or with, or by a third-party provider
5	Approve academic requirements for award courses, including: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. the course name</li> <li>b. the credit points required at each unit level for award courses</li> <li>c. the total credit points required in each of the zones</li> <li>d. for Bachelor degrees, the capstone and PACE unit requirements</li> <li>e. the number of essential units required</li> <li>f. the inclusion or exclusion of a specific unit as an essential unit</li> <li>g. the total number of units required in an option set and the credit point value of each option set</li> <li>h. the requirement to complete a major, minor, or specialisation</li> <li>i. the inclusion or exclusion of a specific major, minor, or specialisation to meet the requirement in (h) above</li> <li>j. the course learning outcomes</li> </ul>
6	Approve amendments to academic requirements for award courses, including: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. the course name</li> <li>b. the credit points required at each unit level for award courses</li> <li>c. the total credit points required in each of the zones</li> <li>d. for Bachelor degrees, the capstone and PACE unit requirements</li> <li>e. the number of essential units required</li> <li>f. the inclusion or exclusion of a specific unit as an essential unit</li> <li>g. the total number of units required in an option set and the credit point value of each option set</li> <li>h. the requirement to complete a major, minor, or specialisation</li> <li>i. the inclusion or exclusion of a specific major, minor, or specialisation to meet the requirement in (h) above</li> <li>j. a change to the course learning outcomes</li> </ul>
7	Approve a grouping of units as a designated minor
8	Approve the inclusion of a major, specialisation, or designated minor in a course
9	Approve amendments to the learning outcomes for majors and specialisations
10	Approve the credit points required at each level for majors and specialisations
11	Approve English language requirements for admission to University award courses
12	Approve amendments to English language requirements for admission to University award courses
13	Approve proposals for international agreements which involve course development or delivery, including dual degree, articulation, joint degree, or offshore course delivery
14	Approve amendments to proposals for international agreements which involve course development or delivery, including dual degree, articulation, joint degree, or offshore course delivery
15	Approve all amendments to courses, majors, specialisations, or designated minors delivered offshore
16	Approve the designation of a unit as a PACE or Capstone unit
17	Establish and approve amendments to University-wide Inherent Requirements for award courses
18	Establish and approve standards for Work Integrated Learning for units in award courses
19	Approve changes to course study mode (part time/fulltime), delivery location (campus), and delivery mode (distance/face to face)
