

GUARANTEED FAST ENTRY INTO YOUR UNDERGRADUATE DEGREE

Developed specifically to meet Macquarie's entry requirements, our pathway programs are designed so that on successful completion, you can seamlessly transition to the first or second year of your undergraduate degree, as long as you meet the entry requirements.

BE A MACQUARIE UNIVERSITY STUDENT FROM DAY ONE

As a student at our College, you're a Macquarie University student from day one. You're instantly part of our vibrant university community with countless opportunities to connect with like-minded people.

PROGRAM STRUCTURE

If you're undertaking an undergraduate certificate or diploma, you'll study the same units as first-year undergraduate students, but in smaller classes with hands-on support. This helps ensure your success as a university student.

After you pass four units of an undergraduate certificate - with the required marks - you can go straight into the second session of your undergraduate degree. This means you can be studying your dream degree within six months.

After you pass eight units of a diploma - with the required marks - you can go straight into the second year of your undergraduate degree. If you work hard, it's possible to do this in eight or nine months.

The Standard Foundation Program and the Intensive Program will quickly increase your subject knowledge and academic skills to the level you need for success in your undergraduate degree. You'll study two units each term, which allows you to deeply engage with your chosen area of interest. Each term is seven weeks in duration, comprising six teaching weeks and an exam period.

SMALL CLASSES

Our small class sizes ensure you get personalised support from our highly qualified teachers, and our specially designed teaching and learning activities will improve your university-level study skills and academic knowledge. You'll have some of Australia's best lecturers teaching you as soon as you join Macquarie.


