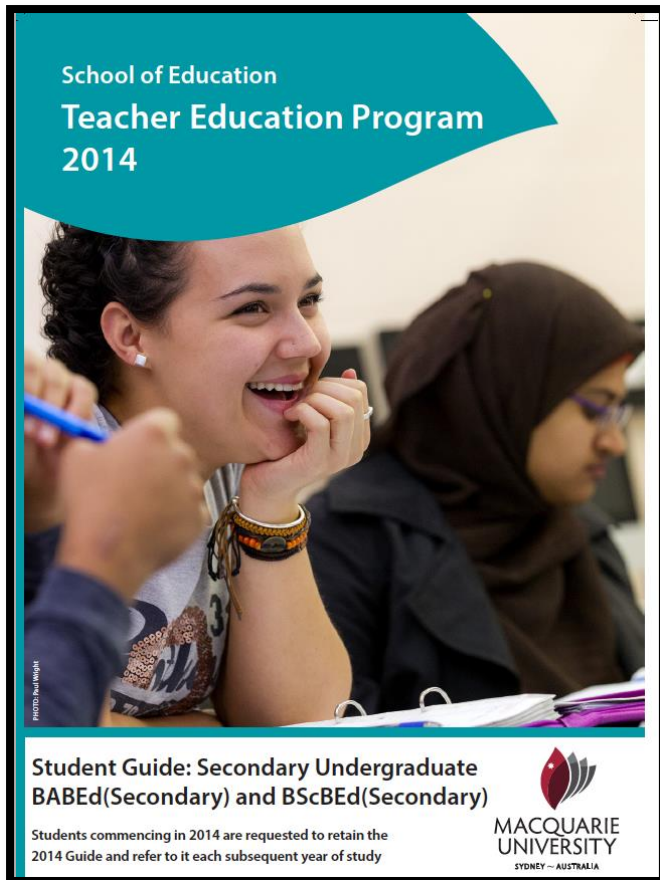





Schedule of Majors

Part 1

1. A candidate may only qualify for a major or minor in a Program of Study if completion of a Qualifying Major is specified in the General Requirements of that Program of Study.
2. To qualify for a major, all of the requirements of the major must be satisfied as specified in [Part 1](#) and [Part 2](#) of the Schedule of Majors.
3. To qualify for more than one major a candidate must:
 - (a) complete all the requirements for each major and, in doing so,
 - (b) complete a minimum of 24 distinct credit points (including 12 distinct credit points at 300 level to 500 level) identified as belonging to each major, where 'distinct credit points' means the credit points are not counted towards qualifying for any other majors or minors for the purposes of this subclause.
4. A candidate may complete a minor, or minors, with each minor comprising a minimum of 12 distinct credit points stipulated for a particular major in Part 2 of the Schedule of Majors, including 6 distinct credit points from that major at 300 level or above, where 'distinct credit points' means from units which are not counted towards any other majors or minors.
5. A candidate may not qualify for a major and a minor with the same name, or for two majors with the same name, within a Program of Study or within double, combined, concurrent or separate Programs of Study.

This unit is intended as an introduction to the field of educational psychology. This field of inquiry combines major theories from the disciplines of psychology and education, and applies these to the context of teaching and learning. The central focus of this unit is on human development. Development and learning are influenced by a range of factors, such as language, cognitive, personal, social, emotional, and physical development. Social and cultural (including indigenous) influences also play a significant role in students' learning experiences, as do school-based factors including teachers' classroom management practices and their skills in motivating students to learn.







- Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) is given for recognised tertiary-level studies undertaken at other accredited institutions. When granted, RPL may count towards the credit point requirement for your degree.

RPL – Seeking Specified Credit

- If you have received unspecified credit you may be able to convert it into Specified Credit (previously known as Exemptions)
 - Specified Credit is a decision made by an Exemptions Officer of the University who decides you need not take a particular unit at Macquarie University because you have successfully completed a similar unit at another recognised institution.
- If you are seeking Specified Credit, it is **essential** to present the following documents to the relevant Exemptions Officer:
RPL confirmation letter
 - Certified academic transcript from your previous institution
 - Variation to Exemptions Form
 - any relevant unit outlines for an Exemptions Officer to assess.

Planning your program
