Nominations and Applications

Nomination Procedure (for Partner Institutions)

Please nominate your students through our <u>Nomination Form</u>. The following documents must be attached to each nomination:

1. Academic transcripts

The minimum academic entry requirement is a Weighted Average Mark (WAM) of:

- Non-Law students = 60
- Law students = 65

Please attach your student's most up-to-date transcript including the following information:

- The degree name. If this information is not included in your institution's transcript template, please provide a letter indicating the name of the degree and academic level.
- Credit value for each subject

<u>Nominating Postgraduate Students</u>: for students coming on postgraduate exchange, please provide the following documents:

- Most up-to-date postgraduate transcript
- Undergraduate final transcript and degree award

2. Proof of English language proficiency (if applicable)

Please provide one of the following options:

a. English Language Proficiency Letter

Applicants from a limited number of Exchange partner universities may provide a letter from their institution as evidence of their English proficiency. The following information must be included in the letter:

- The student is proficient at the B2+ level according to the Common European Framework of Languages.
- If the student has a higher English level, please indicate that the student has "at least a B2+ level".
- The student is currently studying at the partner institution.
- The student is coming to Macquarie University for a short-term exchange program.

b. English Language Tests

The minimum English entry requirement that applies to most undergraduate or postgraduate courses is:

- IELTS Academic: 6.5 overall with 6.0 in each band
- TOEFL iBT: 83 overall, R: 13, W:21, L: 12, S:18
 Only for tests taken from 5 May 2024, these results are valid for Australian visa purposes. Otherwise, any TOEFL iBT tests undertaken between 26 July 2023 to 4 May 2024 will not be accepted. See the English language visa requirements page.
- PTE Academic: 58 overall, minimum 52 in each band
- Cambridge English (C1A or C2P): 180 overall, 169 in each band
- Occupational English Test (OET): R: C+, W: C+, L: C/C+, S: C/C+

Please note:

- Some academic programs have specific entry requirements higher than the minimum. Refer to our <u>English Requirements page</u> for more information.
- All English language test scores must be less than two years old at the date of course commencement at Macquarie.

c. Qualification with English as the Language of Instruction

The University may accept as meeting English proficiency requirements:

- Recognised qualifications from specified English-speaking countries or regions where English was the language of instruction; or
- Qualifications from specific countries with English as an approved subject.

Application Procedure (for Students)

After your home university has nominated you for an exchange program with us, you will be able to <u>apply</u> <u>direct to Macquarie University</u>.

As part of the application via our **StudyLink Portal**, you must upload the following:

- Copy of your passport
- Academic transcripts: Official academic transcripts of current degree as well as Undergraduate Degree if applying for the Postgraduate Exchange program. If the transcript is in a language other than English, you must provide a certified English translation.
- Proof of English proficiency as stated on our English Language Requirements page

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OSHC (Overseas Student Health Cover)

Choosing your units

Unit Guide: information about staff contacts, learning outcomes, assessment tasks, delivery and resources.

Course Handbook: unit overview, level, offerings, pre-requisites, learning outcomes, assessments, learning and teaching activities.

You can select and study units from any of our faculties. While selecting the units, you must consider the following:

- Units are offered in the enrolled semesters:
 - o Session 1: February to June, OR
 - o Session 2: July December
- Students cannot enrol in units that are not offered at their level of study (i.e. Undergraduate students can only enrol in undergraduate units. Postgraduate students can only enrol in postgraduate units).
 - O Undergraduate level (UG) = 1000, 2000 and 3000 level units
 - o Postgraduate level (PG) = 6000, 8000 and 9000 level
- You must ensure that you have met the academic equivalent prerequisites at your home university for the units you want to enrol in.
- You must have approval from your home university to enrol in the units you choose.

Postgraduate students: Please note that 6000 level units are foundational units which might have been covered in your undergraduate degree in the same field.



Restricted Units

Check the <u>list of restricted units</u> to see which units are not available to Exchange students.

Note: Postgraduate Psychology units are not available to incoming exchange students.



Programs with Special Entry Requirements

Postgraduate Law School: Students must have completed 180 ECTS to be admitted to the postgraduate exchange Law program. Students can study 8000- level units.

Bachelor of Clinical Science: Admission to units in this degree is not guaranteed and is subject to a cap.

Enrolment Considerations

Enrolment Requirements

- Students can select to study between 3 to 4 units (30 40 credit points) for each exchange session. Students cannot enrol in fewer units to comply with their visa requirements.
- Students can study up to one-third of the units online (i.e., 1 unit).

Prerequisite waivers


