


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ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF COUNTRY

Developed specifically to meet Macquarie's entry requirements, our pathway programs are designed so that on successful completion, you can seamlessly transition to the first or second year of your undergraduate degree, as long as you meet the entry requirements.

BE A MACQUARIE UNIVERSITY STUDENT FROM DAY ONE

As a student at our College, you're a Macquarie student from day one. You're instantly part of our vibrant university community with countless opportunities to connect with like-minded people.

PROGRAM STRUCTURE

The College offers three pathway programs: Diplomas, the Standard Foundation Program and the Intensive Program.

If you're undertaking a diploma, you'll study the same units as first-year undergraduate students, but in smaller classes with hands-on support. This helps ensure your success as a university student.

After you pass eight units of a diploma - with the required marks - you can go straight into the second year of your undergraduate degree. If you work hard, it's possible to do this in eight or nine months.

The Standard Foundation Program and the Intensive Program will quickly increase your subject knowledge and academic skills to the level you need for success in your undergraduate degree. You'll study two units each term, which allows you to deeply engage with your chosen area of interest.

SMALL CLASSES

Our small class sizes ensure you get personalised support from our highly qualified teachers, and our specially designed teaching and learning activities will improve your university-level study skills and academic knowledge.

ADJUSTMENT FACTORS

You may be eligible to receive adjustments - points that can be added to your ATAR or average mark - through our adjustment factor schemes.



Progress into Year 2

DIPLOMAS

Diplomas are equivalent to the first year of a bachelor degree. If you successfully complete your diploma and meet the entry requirements, you can progress directly into the second year of an undergraduate degree without losing any time. Macquarie offers two diploma pathways into a bachelor degree: a direct pathway and a flexible pathway. If you're certain about which bachelor degree you wish to articulate into, the direct pathway is recommended. This pathway allows you to bundle your diploma and bachelor degree together in a single offer.


