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**1. MINUTES OF MEETING HELD ON 13 MARCH 2012**

The minutes of the meeting held on 13 March 2012 were approved.

**2. BUSINESS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES**

2.1 Report to Academic Senate

The Committee noted that Academic Senate at its meeting on 3 April 2012 approved the recommendations of the ASQC meetings held on 28 February and 13 March 2012.

2.2 Co-Teaching

The Committee noted that the Chair of Academic Senate has tasked the Deputy Registrar to initiate an audit of all co-teaching for 2013. The aim of the audit is to ensure that where co-teaching occurs across levels, the two levels are distinct in terms of resources, learning outcomes and assessment.

The Committee noted that in the guidelines developed at the last ASQC meeting (tabled) to provide further guidance to the faculties in their development of the new research unit

proposals, the point on co-teaching states that “Where any 700 level unit is co-taught with an 800 level unit, the units should also be NCCW with one another”. The Committee considered the response from the Associate Dean, Learning and Teaching, Faculty of Arts (tabled) on this issue. In his response he argued that contrary to the guideline on co-teaching, there should be no NCCW between 700 and 800 level units. This argument was supported by the rationale that “the onus is on Faculty/convenors to ensure that distinctive learning outcomes and assessment tasks are sufficient to differentiate two units which might share (some) content and activities.”

While the Committee acknowledged that there is merit in the above argument, it was agreed that a recommendation on the issue of NCCW in co-teaching should not be made until the audit of all co-teaching is completed. In the interim, the Committee agreed that there should be no mandate in the application of NCCWs between 700 and 800 level units. In cases where no NCCW is applied between co-taught 700 and 800 level units, the Faculty will be required to demonstrate that the units are sufficiently distinct from one another. The quality assurance role of the FSQC was considered to be key in this process. Members also expressed the need for faculties to ensure consistency at all levels of teaching against the AQF.

### **3. INDIVIDUAL STUDENT CASES**

#### **3.1 Appeal [SID 30586526]**

The Chair reported on an appeal against a Faculty of Arts deeming decision that had been received and considered by a working group of the ASQC. The student had requested the deeming of a unit (Psychology of Law) as equivalent to a social science unit, to allow him to qualify for the Bachelor of Social Science instead of the Bachelor of Arts. The Faculty did not approve the request. The appeal argued that the unit would have been considered adequate to be deemed as a social science unit at the time it was completed (early 2000s), to allow the student to qualify for either the Bachelor of Social Science or the Bachelor of Arts. The student had received advice to this effect at the time. The working group of the ASQC recommended that the appeal be upheld. The Committee agreed to approve this recommendation and to forward it to Academic Senate for noting.

#### **3.2 Faculty Reports**

The Committee noted reports received from each of the faculties.

The Committee also noted a draft reporting template prepared by APS. It was agreed that a schedule also be attached to the template to advise faculties on the details required to accompany each case, eg. Savings – student saved from x cps.

#### **4.1 2012 Academic Program**

##### **Emergency Changes to the Schedule of Units**

##### **Faculty of Business and Economics**

*LEX300 Social Innovation, Governance and Professional Leadership*

The Sub-Committee considered the Faculty’s request to add a Commerce designation to LEX300. Consultation between the Faculty of Arts and the Faculty of Business and Economics has been provided and was noted by the Sub-Committee.

The Committee **RECOMMENDS THAT ACADEMIC SENATE** approves the Emergency Change request to add a Commerce designation to LEX300 Social Innovation, Governance and Professional Leadership, effective immediately.

### **Faculty of Human Sciences**

*LING398      Phonetics: Transcription & Theory*

The Sub-Committee considered the Faculty's request to add LING210 and LING217 as NCCW units to LING398.

The Committee **RECOMMENDS THAT ACADEMIC SENATE** approves the Emergency Change request to add LING210 and LING217 as NCCW units to LING398 Phonetics: Transcription & Theory, effective immediately.

### Proposal to Nominate Existing Unit as a Capstone in 2012

### **Faculty of Science**

*BIOL313      Plants: Cells to Ecosystems*

The Sub-Committee discussed the proposal to nominate BIOL313 as a Capstone unit for 2012 and raised the following concerns. The Sub-Committee had requested that this proposal be submitted on 5 July 2011. This proposal has therefore missed the deadlines for submission and it would cause significant problems to implement the request at this stage. The Sub-Committee also observed that, since this proposal is only for 2012, ONLY students who wish to qualify under the 2012 program should be able to use BIOL313 as a Capstone unit. It was identified that 29 students are currently enrolled in the unit who may be affected by the proposal. The Sub-Committee recommended that the Faculty put forward an individual case for those students who are affected and who wish to use BIOL 313 as Capstone in order to qualify this year. Further the Sub-Committee noted that a change of unit code is required when there is a substantial change of content to the unit.

The Committee noted that the Sub-Committee agreed not to recommend the proposal to nominate BIOL313 as a Capstone unit in 2012. It was noted that the Sub-Committee recommended that the Department of Biology identify the students who want to use BIOL313 as their Capstone unit and put forward an individual case for those students requesting that the deeming provision be applied.

## **4.2      2013 Academic Program**

### Academic Case for the Establishment of a New Major

### **Faculty of Arts**

*Public Policy, Law and Governance*

The Sub-Committee discussed the request for the new Major in Public Policy, Law and Governance and agreed that it was a well structured proposal. The Sub-Committee also suggested that the Faculty consider adding a policy oriented Sociology unit to the program as it is relevant to public policy. The following units were suggested as possibilities: SOC223 Social Inequality and Social Policy, SOC311 Justice and Social Order and SOC322 Care and Human Services.

The Committee **RECOMMENDS THAT ACADEMIC SENATE** approves the introduction of the Major in Public Policy, Law and Governance, with effect from 1 January 2013.

The Committee agreed that there is a need to revisit the assessment policy in regards to the allocation of 20% to class participation and the requirement that group work be assessed on a Pass or Fail basis.

### **5.1 2013 Academic Program**

#### Case for the Establishment of a New Award

##### *Doctor of Advanced Surgery*

The Subcommittee considered the proposal for the new award and program of study for the Master of Advanced Surgery. The program consists of 4 coursework units (32cp), a 1 year research thesis (32cp) and 4 practice portfolio units (32cp). It was noted that the program structure meets the AQF guidelines for a professional doctorate. Graduates of the Master of Advanced Surgery will be eligible for a maximum of 32 credit points advanced standing upon articulation to the Doctor of Advanced Surgery, providing the articulation is within 4 years.

The Committee **RECOMMENDS THAT ACADEMIC SENATE RECOMMENDS TO COUNCIL** the approval of the introduction of the award and program of study for the Doctor of Advanced Surgery, with effect from 1 January 2013.

## **5.2 Exiting with Lesser Award**

The Committee noted that the Postgraduate Sub-Committee discussed issues around nested and exit awards with respect to currency, coursework articulations and exemption.

The Committee agreed that a working party (to consist of representatives from faculties) chaired by Associate Professor Coutts be convened to discuss and formulate recommendations around nested and exit awards with respect to currency, coursework articulations and exemption.

## **5.3 Disestablishment of HDR Research Pathways replaced by the introduction of the Master of Research**

The Sub-Committee discussed the implications of the introduction of the Master of Research and suggested that Postgraduate Research Diplomas and Certificates or units embedded in Masters degrees that previously allowed for a pathway to HDR research will need to be reviewed. It was suggested that the HDR pathways continue to be offered in 2013 but be

reviewed with consideration given to discontinuance in 2014. In addition, any specialisations existing within coursework programs that provide a pathway to HDR will need to be reviewed. Faculties are therefore encouraged to also review all stand-alone units, in particular Projects/Dissertation units which are greater than 4 credit points that are used as HDR pathways. Faculties are also requested to advise the Sub-Committee if they intend to withdraw any Research pathway specialisations in 2013.

The Committee **RECOMMENDS THAT ACADEMIC SENATE** approves that Faculties be advised to review all HDR Pathways such as stand-alone awards, embedded specialisations and/or units, as they may need to be discontinued from 31 December 2013.

## 6. PARTICIPATION UPDATE

The Committee noted the report *Update on PACE, Including List of Units that are likely to be proposed as Participation Units for 2013*. Ms Lindie Clark provided a verbal update on the status of Participation unit proposals for the 2013 Academic Program. The Committee noted that a large number of these nominations will be submitted to the Undergraduate Sub-Committee for consideration at its 1 May meeting, with a view to subsequent consideration by ASQC at its 15 May meeting.

## 7. UNDERGRADUATE CERTIFICATES AND DIPLOMAS

The Committee considered a proposal submitted by the Executive Dean, Faculty of Arts that the Certificate of Ancient Languages and Certificate of Languages only exist as exit awards from the Diploma of Ancient Languages and Diploma of Languages respectively. This proposal was put forward in order that the University better align with recent changes to Federal Policy.

### **13.1 Prerequisites for 300 level units**

The Committee discussed the principles in regards to prerequisites and corequisites for 300 level units. These principles were approved by Academic Senate at their 15 November 2011 meeting and were included as part of the circulation of the draft 2013 Schedule of Undergraduate Units to faculties. The Committee noted that the underlying principle behind these guidelines was that students should not be attempting third year units until after the completion of their second year of study. It was however recognised that exceptions may apply in some cases. The Committee therefore agreed to **RECOMMEND THAT ACADEMIC SENATE** approves that the following principle be amended as follows:

“3. If individual units are specified without a maturity prerequisite as prerequisites the prerequisite should **normally** include a minimum of 6 credit points at 200 level.”

### **13.2 ASQC Membership - Library Representative**

Ms Maxine Brodie introduced Ms Fiona Burton, Associate University Librarian as the new library representative on ASQC. Ms Brodie advised that she will continue to provide assistance where required until the end of 2012.
