Success in the MRFF's Indigenous Health Research Fund

Head of the Department of Linguistics and chief investigator of the Aboriginal Children's Hearing Health program, **Prof Catherine McMahon**, has been awarded \$744,026 over two years through the <u>MRFF Indigenous Health</u> <u>Research Scheme</u> for her project, The Systematically and Together Overcoming Racism Model (STORM).

The project aims to develop and validate a tool to assess racism in the hearing health sector, assessing the amount of racism which currently exists, and codesigning aligned policies and practices across the sector. Five of seven CIs on the project team are Indigenous leaders, clinicians and/or researchers. Project partners are Indigenous Allied Health Australia (IAHA), the National Aboriginal Community Controlled Health Organisation (NACCHO), Audiology Australia, the Australian Society of Otolaryngology Head and Neck Surgery, Speech Pathology Australia, Hearing Aid Audiology Society of Australia, Australian College of Audiology, Audiometry Nurses Association of Australia, First Voice, and the National Association of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Health Workers and Practitioners.

ARC 2025 Discovery Projects: a 2-stage application process

The ARC has confirmed there will be a <u>two-stage application process for DP25</u>, commencing with an Expression of Interest (EOI). Shortlisted applicants will be invited to submit a full application. The following is available via <u>GrantConnect</u>:

- Preliminary EOI Instructions to
- Applicants

The ARC has released the following <u>key</u> dates:

- EOIs open: 22 Jan 2024
- EOIs close: 26 Feb 2024
- EOI outcomes: 8-10 Apr 2024Full apps open: 11 Apr 2024
- Full apps close: 3 June 2024
- Rejoinders: 7-20 Aug 2024
- Full app outcomes: 20-29 Nov 2024

Investigators named on your application will be locked in at the EOI stage so begin building your team now. Project limits for CIs will apply at the EOI stage. The EOI assessment criteria:

- Investigator(s)/Capability 30%
- Project Quality & Innovation 70%

The Grant Development Team is now developing internal key dates, processes, resources and support for applicants. This will be made available on the <u>Discovery Project information</u> <u>webpage</u> in the coming days.

Authorship & By-Lines - getting it right

Clearly acknowledging and crediting those who have contributed to your research is essential to research integrity and transparency. <u>The</u> <u>Macquarie University Research</u> <u>Authorship Policy</u>, recently updated, provides explicit guidance and responsibilities for fair and honest attribution of authorship. This update encompasses several crucial elements:

- Requirement for all authors to have an <u>ORCID</u>.
- Assertion that authorship cannot be assigned to Generative Artificial Intelligence.
- Instructions for reporting institutional affiliations through a by-line.

By-lines are an important type of acknowledgement as they offer recognition to both individuals and institutions behind the research. By-lines influence perceptions of research accountability, discoverability, and reputation. To ensure a consistent approach, researchers should consult the new <u>Macquarie University Research</u> <u>By-Line Guidance Note</u>.

The new MQ NOI Form is now live!

The Macquarie University Notification of Intent (NOI) is a newly developed onestop form to notify key research support teams at Macquarie of your intention to apply for competitive research grants, engage with partners or work with philanthropic funders. Once reviewed by the appropriate research support team the NOI will generate a Pure Application record. You will need to enrich the Pure record with additional details, but the NOI will do a lot of it for you. One form will do two jobs!
